From the President


Hello my fellow Artists,


Please arrive by 9am to set up for a 9.30 start (no access after 9.30). Session finishes at 12.30pm.


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DONNA McKELLAR. PRESENTATION FEED-BACK



Donna McKellar's presentation last month was on the next level. She is a lovely, warm, friendly, generous artist, who willingly shared her process, from how she starts with a bright red wash on her canvas, to her seemingly abstract way of placing her marks on the beginnings of her composition.





One would have thought Donna used a 2 hair brush, this myth was busted when she explained how she started a painting.

Donna's demonstration was exceptionally enlightening and enthusiastically received by the enthralled audience.

DINING WITH THE MASTERS

Have you ever imagined being able to invite some of the great artists to dine with you? The idea of being able to converse about their Art, over good food and wine is incredible is it not?

My personal choice for the ideal dinner guests would start with Claude Monet, who would have many tales to tell, one in particular about his friendship with Édouard Manet, with the story behind his work 'Le Dejeuner Sur' and the outrage that it caused at the time.






Another interesting and vibrant

choice would be Frédéric Bazille, whose life ended far too short at the age of 28, after being shot in the Franco Prussian war at the Battle of Beaune-la-Rolande in 1870. He was just twenty-three years old when he painted several of his best-known works, including 'The Pink Dress', 'Thérèse des Hours' and his best-known 'Family Reunion', painted in 1867–1868 (Musée d'Orsay, Paris).

Paul Cézanne would set everyone thinking. He never really fitted in with the impressionists, insisting that he was creating something new. He was fascinated with the mountain scenes in the South of France and produced over 30 paintings of the area, including 'La Montagne Saint-Victoire'. In latter years Pablo Picasso would purchase a Château there.

Perhaps John Singer Sargent would be an interesting addition with the story behind the Portrait of Madam X, Virginie Amélie Avegno Gautreau, the wife of a



French banker. The scandal of that painting was a dramatic setback for Sargent, as the public hated it! It was accused of being a brazen image of a woman. My, how things have changed.

I also thought of inviting William Turner, that is until I watched a movie about him entitled 'Mr Turner'. He was portrayed by Timothy Spall as brusk, illmannered and generally not good dinner company. He was rude to his fellow humans but very focused on his art. His father it would seem, played a large part in his fame. Nevertheless a very enjoyable movie. Watch the Trailer: Mr Turner

SASA PLEIN AIR OUTING



Unfortunately we have not been supplied with the dates or a venue for our next event at the time of sending this Newsletter out. In the meantime, we would like to explain a little more about the concept of En Plein Air painting. It is a French expression meaning "in the open air", and refers to the act of painting outdoors with the artist's subject in full view. Plein air artists capture the spirit and essence of a landscape or subject by incorporating natural light, color and movement into their works.

What equipment do you need for Plein Air Painting? Suitable clothing and refreshments to start with.

- Brushes: A good set and variety of brushes is essential for painting.
- Easel and Palette combo: A portable easel will allow you to set up your painting station anywhere. During the mid-19th century the 'box easel', typically known as the 'French box easel' or 'field easel', was invented. These highly portable easels with telescopic legs and built-in paint box and palette made it easier to go into the forest and up the hillsides. Still made today, they remain a popular choice (even for home use) since they fold up to the size of a brief case and thus are easy

to store. The Pochade Box is a compact box that allows the artist to keep all their supplies and palette within the box and have the work on the inside of the lid.

- Oil paint: The best type of paint to use for plein air painting. Some Plein Air painters may not agree, as water colour and acrylics are also used.
- The best surface for plein air painting? Gessobord is a good option as it comes primed and ready to paint. It does have a fine tooth finish, which means it's a pretty smooth surface. If you prefer more texture, you can use a smooth hardbord and apply a layer of gesso or white acrylic paint or use premade canvas panels.

Famous Plein Air painters included: Claude Monet, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, and Camille Pissarro, the leaders of Impressionism also Alfred Sisley and Frédéric Bazille.



□ IN MEMORIAM. MASTER FELLOW - JEREMY DAY



Our esteemed Master Fellow Jeremy Day sadly passed away on the 4th of May. He will be sorely missed by all SASA members and the entire Art world.

Jeremy was born in London in 1945 and emigrated to Cape Town with his war-widowed mother on a Union-Castle liner in 1946.

He started drawing as soon as he could hold a pencil, and this was the beginning of what would be an art-based career.

An early influence in fine detail work were freelance projects in Jeremy's mid-teens, entailing the design of miniature colour sketches of hundreds of garment labels, most with brush lettering as small as 1.5mm high.

After a 3 year stint at Graphic Art school, exposure to advertising campaigns led to the formation of a graphic design and advertising business in 1975, including illustration work for larger agencies, especially airbrush work.

There was always a constant desire to pursue realism with a paintbrush, especially with quirky subject matter, originally inspired by UK artist Michael English. The late Erik Laubscher stimulated Jeremy's desire to go further.





Jeremy was placed in the Top 100 of the 2013 and 2015 Sanlam National Portrait Competitions.

He joined SASA in 2011 and his participation in the SASA exhibitions led him to gaining the highest scores over 3 out of 4 consecutive Annual Exhibitions, resulting in a Fellowship in 2014 and Senior Fellowship in 2017. Jeremy attained Master Fellowship status in 2022. In 2023 he donated a trophy for the highest score achieved by a participating artist at Selection Weekend – **The Jeremy Day Award**, with the first recipient being sculptor Boniface Chikwenhere.

Our sincere condolences go out to Jeremy's wife Penny and all the family, from the Council and Members of SASA.


