Hi there my fellow artists

It's the month of June, I hope you have booked for the Life drawing which started on Sat. 8th June until Sat. 6th July.

We had a treat at the last month's members meeting; Hayden Proud had some wonderful tales to tell about Irma Stern and the Arab Priest painting. Hayden was thrilled to be with us and has agreed to talk again at a later stage. I'm waiting to see what interesting subjects he proposes.

July is the month for Workshops held at the Peter Clark Art Centre on a Saturday morning. The first of which is Ingrid Wallach with some amazing paint pouring techniques to use as background for your paintings amongst other inspiring ideas. Book your space by contacting the secretary. colour wheel is the visible spectrum of colours placed on a wheel, the real basis for the colour wheel is rooted in Newton's experiments with prisms, which led to the theory that red, yellow and blue were the primary colours from which all other colours are derived. While that's not entirely true, it's still influential in the colour wheels development in the early 1800s as well as the colour wheel currently used today.


Add to that the secondary colours of violet, orange and green—those which result from mixing the primary colours—and the colour wheel begins to take shape. The tertiary colours yellow-orange, red-orange, red-purple, blue-purple, blue-green and yellow-green complete the colour wheel. How many of you use the colour wheel?

Have you started painting for the Selection Weekend 3rd & 4th August? I did read out the salient points on Thursday night at Members' and the guidelines were emailed to you. If you are still unsure please contact the Secretary or myself and we will guide you through.

Did you ever wonder where the colour wheel came from? It was Sir Isaac Newton! Who would have thought, not me.

Whilst Sir Isaac Newton is known for his discovery of many things his connection to the Colour Wheel is often overlooked.

He first published his findings in his book Opticks in 1704. It appears as though the

□ HAYDEN PROUD, TALK ON IRMA STERN - FEEDBACK



Hayden Proud delivered a captivating talk on Irma Stern's painting Arab Priest, created in 1945. This artwork was acquired by the Qatar Museum Authority (QMA) in 2011 for over R38 million, despite not having a permanent export permit from the South African Heritage Resource Agency (SAHRA).

Hayden was instrumental in establishing a five-year rotation agreement, allowing the artwork to spend four years in Qatar and one year in South Africa. From a Qatari perspective, Stern's work categorizes her as an orientalist, a dubious honour at best, making Arab Priest a valuable addition to Qatar's Museum of Orientalists.




This intriguing exhibition featured works by other acclaimed artists and paraphernalia of the era to contextualize Arab Priest, dramatically juxtaposing it with James Eddie's realist Portrait of Hadjee Izik Fatah, painted in the same year.


The significance of Arab Priest lies in Stern's fascination with Islamic culture, visualised in ornate patterning which she first encountered during a stopover in Zanzibar during a sea journey to Genoa.



Through his work in preserving South African heritage through this work of art, Hayden has secured his legacy in the history of South African art.



In 2019, Hayden was the curator of the installation Irma Stern's **'Arab Priest': Image and Context** at the Iziko South African National Gallery, to showcase the artwork during its South African rotation.





CLIMATE ACTIVIST DEFACES MONET PAINTING IN PARIS

Woman from Riposte Alimentaire arrested after sticking poster on impressionist painter's Coquelicots

A climate activist has been arrested for sticking an adhesive poster on a Monet painting at the Musée d'Orsay in Paris to draw attention to global heating[sic], a police source said.

The action by the woman, a member of Riposte Alimentaire (Food Response) – a group of environmental activists and defenders of sustainable food

(formerly Twitter), placing a blood-red poster over Coquelicots (Poppies) by the French impressionist painter Claude Monet.



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In the video she said of the poster covering Monet's art that "this nightmarish image awaits us if no alternative is put in place".

Monet's painting, completed in 1873, shows people with umbrellas strolling in a blooming poppy field.

It was protected by

glass, but the Musée d'Orsay did not immediately respond to a request for comment on the condition of the painting after the attack.

Riposte Alimentaire has claimed responsibility for several attacks on art in attempts to draw attention to the climate crisis.

They include soup attacks on the Mona Lisa in the Louvre, and on another Monet painting, Springtime, in the Lyon Museum of Fine Arts in February.

During the COVID-19 lockdown, AJ attended an art class 35 years after he'd laid down his brushes and found himself "playing with acrylics" in a neighbour's garage.

He was intrigued to see how the paint moved. Without electricity, a hair dryer, heat gun or even a straw, he blew it with his mouth to see what would happen and loved the way one colour moved through another.

Now an award-winning full-time professional artist, AJ is still literally breathing his life into his large expressionist works, creating mesmerising paintings full of subtle movement with a sense of calm and tranquillity.

"I love the unpredictability of it," he enthuses. "The paint seems to come to life - it keeps moving even when I've finished. And the colours change during the drying process. It's always exciting to go back the next day to see what's happened to the painting."

AJ's work is currently represented in selected galleries in South Africa and the UK.


