Social Media Giant Censors Leopold Museum Artwork.

Vienna, Austria is currently the unlikely location of a David and Goliath-scale battle, where a European museum is taking on a global social media giant. Let's take a look at this latest case of art censorship in social media. The Leopold Museum houses a unique collection of Austrian art and Modernism. They have the big names like Egon Schiele and Gustav Klimt. But there's a problem, according to media giant Meta. They don't want these spectacular and important artworks shared with the world. Why? Because Meta considers these paintings 'explicit' and 'pornographic'.

I know for sure that shocking and brutal images of the human form are freely available on social media. Images promoting misogyny, racism, homophobia, violence – it's all there. We are wading knee-deep

through deep-fake content intending to cause harm. Excuse me Mr Zuckerberg, but these are all still out there, uncensored.






